WELCOME

Welcome to the short Course, "Introduction to Assistive Technologies".

This Course is a joint initiative of the Commonwealth of Learning (Canada) and Diversity and Ability (United Kingdom).

AIM OF THE COURSE

In this 6-week course, you will be introduced to free accessible assistive technology. It will equip you with the skills to support disabled people to use enabling technologies to aid their learning or working. The course will give an understanding of your country's journey so far to Disability inclusion and equality and help you establish your role in reinforcing this.

LEARNING OUTCOMES OF COURSE

By the end of the course, you will be expected to be able to:

- 1. Have a pronounced understanding of Free and Accessible Assistive Technologies
- 2. Identify effective Assistive Technology which lend themselves in different ways to various disabilities/learning differences
- 3. Understand which Assistive Technology may support individual barriers in preparation for Needs Assessments
